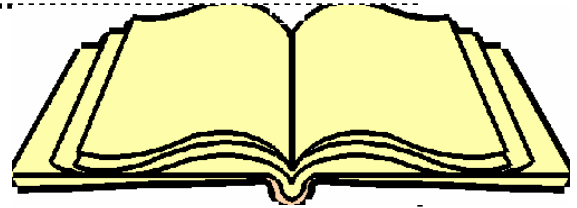
will all share ignorance" as the saying goes. Also, consider entering A&S competitions and exhibitions during the course of the year.

BOOK REVIEW

Farming in the First Millenium A.D.: British Agriculture between Julius Caesar and William the Conqueror, by Peter Fowler. (Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 2002).



The book looks at primarily archaeological evidence for farming in Britain, including old ploughing patterns visible in deserted villages, livestock remains, tool remains. Documentary evidence is included when available. Photographic and line drawing illustrations draw on modern re-creations as well as archeology. The author is very clear about what sources he uses and the range of sources available. There is an interesting discussion of the development of the plough, sizes and prevalence of animal species in investigated sites, types of technology, and other fascinating topics. The list of resources is large and excellent, and provides a good jumping-off spot...
